

Know Your Therapist

How does each therapist work with your child? What qualifications to expect in each therapist?



Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA) Therapist

Helps modify behaviour. Therapist will assess child's behaviour & design behavior-change plan for them.



- Board Certified Behaviour Analyst
 BCBA
- Board Certified
 Assistant Behaviour
 Analysts –BCaBA
- Board Certified Behaviour Analyst Doctoral-BCBA-D

Both require at least graduate degree.

This may happen through:

- · Reducing problem behaviour.
- Teaching appropriate behaviour like:
 - Writing & reading.
 - Language development.
 - Communication.
 - Academic skills.
 - Play skills.
 - ADL skills.
 - Eating.
 - Social skills.
- Increasing the persistence of appropriate behaviours.

Note: ABA certification doesn't mean this therapist is qualified to assess

Note: Autism Spectrum Disorders.That certification is separate.















- Bachelors / Doctorate in Audiology
- Bachelors / Masters in Audiology & Speech Language Pathology (BASLP / MASLP)

Audiologist

Audiologist can diagnose & manage auditory disorders like poor hearing / poor balance.

They can:

- Understand ear anatomy, physiology, & acoustics.
- Teach lip-reading & sign language to help you & your child communicate.
- Fitting of cochlear implants.
- Study your child's condition to design & fit a hearing aid.













 Bachelors / Masters in Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapist (OT)

Helps your child develop, regain, or improve skills needed for everyday activities.

They use:

- Therapeutic exercises.
- · Play activities.
- Assistive technologies.
- · Environmental modification.
- Disability equipment like wheelchairs.

This improves:

- Gross & fine motor skills.
- · Attention.
- · Coordination skills.
- Writing skills.
- Independence level in daily routine activities.
- · Sensory awareness.
- · Pain relief.

Behavioural Therapist

BehaviourTherapist tries to understand the reason for your child's specific behaviours.

They may be trained in:

- Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT)
 Focuses on the thoughts & feelings behind behaviour patterns.
- Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA)
 Focuses on child's response to different stimuli. This helps design a strategy to correct inappropriate helpsylour.

















 Masters / Doctorate in Counseling psychology

Counselor


Can help your child (or you) discuss thoughts & feelings about any issue in a constructive way.

They do so:

- · without bias or judgment.
- with complete confidentiality.
- · to help explain the problem.
- to help resolve / accept the situation.











Dermatologist

Specialist for skin, scalp, hair, & nails.

- They can help your child with skin conditions caused by excessive rubbing / picking.
- They will keep in mind if your child is hypersensitive, hyposensitive, or sensation-seeking while designing a treatment plan.



 MD in Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy















- · Assess developmental delays.
- Evaluates your child's age-specific milestones.

Specializes in developmental delays / disabilities.

Developmental Pediatrician

 Guide you through bringing your child's development up to speed.



- MD/DNB in Pediatrics with Developmental Pediatrics as super specialty
- Fellowship in Developmental Pediatrics

Note

If you cannot find a developmental pediatrician to assess your child's developmental level, ask the pediatrician about the next step.













- MD (Psychiatry) or **DNB** Psychiatry
 - With additional Postdoctoral Fellowship (PDF) in Child & Adolescent **Psychiatry**
 - Diploma in **Psychological** Medicine (DPM)

Psychiatrist

Medical specialist in mental & emotional disorders.

Special-needs children are vulnerable to:

- Anxiety disorders.
- Obsessive compulsive disorder (OCD).
- · Eating disorders.
- · Aggressive behaviours.

They can prescribe:

- Behavioural treatments.
- Medication.
- · Individual & family therapy sessions.

Their recommendation is mandatory for receiving a disability certificate for intellectual disabilities















 Bachelors/Masters in Physiotherapy

Physiotherapist

Physiotherapist is the medical specialist for physical & motor development.

They can help with:

- · Posture management.
- Using equipment like a wheelchair.
- · Exercise therapy.
- Advise to parents on encouraging good patterns of movement.

Physiotherapy is non-invasive & does not involve medication.

They take the form of:

- · massages,
- · exercises, &/or
- · collective activities

To strengthen & improve the body's movement.















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 Teachers / psychologists with certifications in special-needs education/ Dyslexia such as 'Certified Dyslexia Therapist Training Program'

Dyslexia Therapist

They can:

- Assess if your child has difficulties with reading / writing.
- Design an intervention based on the assessment.
- Prescribe remedial education / multi-sensory learning techniques.
- Suggest ways to improve concentration, organisation, & memory.

Financial Consultant

Financial consultant can help create custom financial plans for:

- Analyzing your current financial situation towards the lifetime care of your child.
- Drafting a will.
- Opening up Trust fund for your child.
- Choosing the life / health insurance most suited for your child's disability.
- Designing best suited investment strategies.

Neurologist

Paediatric neurologist specializes in issues of your child's brain & spinal cord.

They can diagnose & manage:

- Sensory challenges.
- Behavioural disturbances.
- Movement disorders.
- Delayed speech.

- Muscle tone deficits.
- · Head injuries.
- Fine & gross motor delays.
- Seizures.

Note: If you cannot find a paediatric neurologist, find a neurologist (who treats adults) for advice on the next best step.













- MD Gynecology
- Super specialization in Reproductive Endocrinology & Infertility

Gynaecologist

Specialist for issues of the female reproductive system.

They deal with your concerns about:

- · Reproduction & contraception.
- PMS & menstruation.
- Infertility.















- Bachelors in Nutrition or Dietetics
- Masters in Nutrition or Dietetics


Nutritionist / Dietitian

Deals with issues of food & nutrition.

- Adequate nutrition can make a big difference for children with special needs.
- It can help improve their learning capacity & emotional management.
- Nutritionist / dietitian can :
 - Assess your child's nutritional health.
 - Design strategies to improve nutrition.
 - Guide you through ways to encourage your child to eat better.
 - Prescribe supplements / restrictions.

- Fellowship in Pediatric & Adolescent Endocrinology

Pediatric Endocrinologist

Can diagnose & manage hormonal issues like:

- Early / delayed puberty.
- Under / overactive thyroid &/or pituitary gland.
- Ovarian / testicular dysfunctions.
- Diabetes.
- Other growth / sexual developmental issues.

They can guide you through resolving these issues with minimal disruption to your child's daily life.











Bachelors in Homeopathic

Medicine & Surgery

(BHMS)

Homeopathic Physician

Homeopathy is an alternative to allopathy.

- Sources of medicine are natural substances like arnica herb & snake venom.
- . The medicine may come in the form of
 - sugar pellets.
 - ointments.
 - liquids.
 - tablets.
 - lotions.

Note: Organisation has warned patients not to consider it as an absolute cure. Give your child homeopathy at your own discretion.

- Pediatric
 Ophthalmology

Pediatric Ophthalmologist

Pediatric Ophthalmologist specializes in :

- Eye diseases.
- Visual development.
- · Vision care.
- Head tilting.
- Squints.

They can assess the causes of the problem & prescribe management / treatment.













 Post-graduation (DNB /MD) in Pediatrics


Pediatrician

- Pediatrician is the medical specialist for those from 0 y-o-a to about 18 y-o-a.
- They (along with general physicians) are your first point of contact for children's medical issues.
- They can diagnose intellectual & developmental disabilities.















 Certificate courses on Remedial Education

Remedial Educator

Remedial educator teaches a child through his/her own customized unique learning means, in fields such as :

- Arithmetic.
- Reading.

Writing.Speaking.

Spelling.

Memory.

They help children with learning disabilities & other special needs.

Note: Nayi Disha's minimum criteria for listing remedial educators on the service directory is a course of I-3 months.

Psychologist

A psychologist is a health professional who can:

- Diagnose learning & behavioural disorders.
- Provide counseling.
- Design behaviour management.

A developmental psychologist can:

- Assess developmental delays in the child.
- Use standardized tests to diagnose disabilities.
- Propose treatment programs like
 - Animal therapy.
 - Relaxation therapy.
 - Cognitive behavior therapy (CBT).
 - Art therapy.

Their recommendation is mandatory for receiving a disability certificate for intellectual disabilities













- Bachelors / Masters in Fine Arts, Psychology, or Social Work
- Post Graduate Diploma in Clinical Music Therapy
- Diploma certification courses in art therapy
- Certifications from reputed organizations conducting art therapy crash courses

Recreational Therapist

Recreational therapists uses recreational-based treatments like:

- Music.
- · Dance.
- Drama
- · Sports.

This helps to:

- · Gain confidence.
- Increase independence in everyday activities.
- · Improve social integration skills.

The key idea is to focus on the child's interests.

It is hence highly individualized treatment, which makes it more relevant & meaningful.













 Officially even a intermediate holder is qualified


Shadow Teacher

- A shadow teacher accompanies your child in the classroom & devotes their full attention to your child only.
- They ensure to explain all academic concepts in a manner best suited to your child & their disability.

 $\mathsf{Note}:\mathsf{Any}\;\mathsf{Diploma}$ in teaching or learning will add an added benefit.













 Bachelors / Masters in Social Work (BSW / M.A / MSW)

Social Worker

Liaison between families, governmental organisations & NGOs that provide support services.

They can:

- Counsel you regarding professional help & government services.
- Inform you of your rights.
- Help you find vocational rehabilitation i.e. training & employment for your child.

May be involved in the administration, management, & policy-planning of government / NGO operations.













- Diploma in Sports Coaching
- Certifications in Disability Sports Coaching
- Diploma in Adapted Physical Education

Disability Sports Coach

Can train your child in various physical & outdoor activities

They adapt the activities based on your child's strengths & restrictions.

They may also act as a:

- Strength & conditioning specialist.
- Sports nutritionist.
- Physiotherapist.
- Sports masseuse.













Bachelors / Masters in Audiology & Speech Language Pathology (BASLP / MASLP)

Speech Therapist

Specializes in issues of speech & language & swallowing that occur due to:

- Stroke or brain injury.
- · Hearing loss.
- Developmental delay.
- Oromotor defects such as cleft palates.
- · Cerebral palsy.
- · Emotional dysregulation.
- · Oro-motor exercises for the jaw, gums, tongue and facial muscles.

They can:

- · Help your child speak with clarity.
- · Helps your child speak & interact socially.
- Prescribe exercises to strengthen face muscles for speech clarity & improve feeding skills.
- Teach alternative communication methods like sign language, picture/electronic communication.













- Registered Yoga Trainer (RYT) certification
- PG Diploma in Yoga Therapy

Yoga Therapist


A yoga therapist can improve overall mental health, physical health, & movement through *aasans* & breathing exercises.

They can customize exercises to suit your child's strengths & needs. Aasans can be adapted for performance on a wheelchair.

Note: Yoga is not a cure but a management strategy. Use it alongside your prescribed medical care & other therapy regimes.













 Diploma / B. Ed. / M. Ed. / PhD in Special Education

Special Educational Needs (SEN) Teacher

Teaches your child how to learn

They cater to children with:

- Physical disabilities.
 Learning difficulties.
- Hearing or visual impairment.
 Speech or language difficulties.

They can:

- Assess your child's learning level.
- Prepare lesson plans accordingly.
- Use Braille / sign language.
- Help child build classroom social skills
 & use these in other social settings.













- Bachelors in Optometry
- Fellowship in Vision Therapy

Vision Therapist

A vision therapist provides non-surgical treatment for common visual problems like :

- Lazy eyes.
- Crossed eyes.
- · Double vision.

They can provide exercises for the entire visual system. This is useful for issues that cannot be treated with eyeglasses, contact lenses, &/or surgery alone.

Optometrists work only on eye muscles & alignment.

Note: Vision therapists focus on the entire visual system, including areas of the brain that control visual perception.
